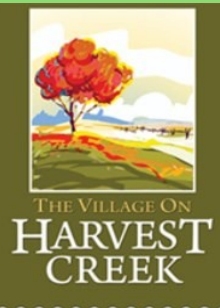

## Annual General Meeting

## Spring Maintenance Update

With the snow finally gone, our landscaping crew will soon begin spring clean-up, including edging the front and common gardens. Mulch application is scheduled for May. Since the front garden areas were completed last year, this season the back common areas—the treed sections behind the homes—will be mulched. Trees along the boulevard will not be mulched, as they were done last year. Please note that mulching within allotted personal garden spaces remains the responsibility of individual owners.

The irrigation team will also open the system and replace any damaged sprinkler heads. A friendly reminder to avoid driving over the sprinkler heads—broken heads are an unnecessary annual expense for all of us. They're located in the grass at the corners of your driveway where it meets the street.

The Board has approved Board member Chuck MacFarlane's proposal to contract a full cleaning of our sewer pipes this summer. After many years in operation, this maintenance will help improve water flow and reduce the risk of flooding caused by partially clogged lines.

## Upper Hillside Visitor Parking

As a reminder, we ask residents not to park in the visitor's lots on upper Hillside on Thursdays between 10 am and 4 pm. Zimmerman Landscaping crew requires these spaces to park their vehicles.

## Community Upkeep Reminder

Overall upkeep at The Village on Harvest Creek is a shared responsibility. To help prevent weed growth, please ensure the sand between your driveway pavers is maintained. We also ask that all outdoor areas and personal property be kept tidy and in good repair.
